## Unwanted Newspapers in Driveways

His publication was the 'select' section of the Detroit Free Press and the following information pertains to stopping the 'delivery' of this flyer.

He called the number on the plastic bag it came in and went through the menu items and ended up speaking with a customer service representative. It only took 20 seconds or so before reaching the representative. He was asked to supply my phone number and, as expected, the representative could not find it. He then stated that he was calling about the free "select" edition and asked that delivery to his house be canceled. After providing his address the agent found an active subscription to "select" and indicated that it would take up to two weeks to stop the service. The agent also stated that he should call back if he receive additional copies after the two week period.

To STOP delivery of the Detroit Free Press "select" edition:

- Call 800-395-3300
- "Walk" the menu until reaching a representative
- Reference the "select" edition of the Free Press
- Provide address
- Request cancellation
